THE "WHAT MATTERS MOST?" GAME instructions

- : This is a game to learn about what matters most to you and to those around you.
- : For use with young people aged 11 - 16
- : Can be used in a get to know you session for mentoring, group work, lunch club, tutor time or PHSE lesson
- : Recommended for groups of 3 - 6 young people.
- ▶ Place the tiles face down onto the two grey squares on the game board.
- ▶ Take a moment to read the different options on the game board, from most important at the top (purple) to least important at the bottom (green).
- ▶ Decide who will start (maybe the person who has their birthday next).
- ▶ Take it in turns to pick up a tile, talk about where you might want to place it and why, before making your final choice and placing it on the board.
- ▶ If you choose to place your tile on the very top or very bottom you have to first present your case to the group and allow them to vote yes or no as to whether it can be placed there. If there is a tie, then it is a yes vote.
- ▶ When it is your go and there is another tile in the space where you want to put your tile, you may move that one tile to another place on the board. Remember if it is for the very top or very bottom, the group will need to vote yes for this to happen.
- ▶ If you pick up a tile that you know matters a lot to someone else in the group and you want to give the tile to them, you can leave it in the grey bar in the middle of the board for them to pick up if they want to on their turn (that will be the only move you can make on your turn if you choose to do that).
- ▶ When the board fills up, you can move other tiles or place them in the middle.
- ▶ The game is over when all of the tiles have been turned over.
